

### **BRIEF DESCRIPTION**

This module explores the different approaches to aggregation of vulnerability indices, with an ambition to produce vulnerability profiles to visualise the structure of the risks rather than simple indices. The aim of this approach is to highlight uncertainty and make a vulnerability assessment relevant to adaptation decision-making.

# **SPECIFIC OBJECTIVES**

- Identify what indicators are relevant to the actors in a system and their exposure to present and future risks (from the V-E exercise)
- Explore methods for aggregation of indicators
- Produce stylised profiles for selected exposure units for the case study
- Discussion of important thresholds that may be reached; ecological, socio economic, moral case examples.
- Discuss as a group the benefit of the exercise and how they add to the vulnerability assessment

## **LEARNING OUTCOMES**

- Awareness of the different indicators that could be used in an assessment depending on which field of study is chosen; the nature of the analysis and the spatial and temporal scales of the study and the levels and contexts of the decision making process for which you are providing information.
- Knowledge of the different methods of selection, aggregation and assessment must be understandable to ensure that the results of the assessment are used and can be verified by experts and stakeholders.
- Realisation of vulnerability as a dynamic process and the limitations of the indicators and profiling methods. Vulnerability assessment and indicators are not ends in themselves but have to support the decision - making process for adaptation.

- Aggregates presentation on standardising and weighting, introduction of protocol tables
- Exercise on profiles, produce graphical profiles for several exposure units.
  Ecological, social, and moral thresholds presentation
- Discussion on strengths, weaknesses and challenges of vulnerability assessment
