



reduction agents.





A beautiful 25-year-old royal python, Sense has a special gift for predicting disasters. Grand Mistress Fu feeds her mice every month.

12 years old from Hong Kong, Ping is practical, chatty, creative and loves cooking and Wushu. Ping is the networker and spokesperson within the COPE squad.


Disaster Experience: Floods

Disaster Experience: Landslides


It was spring in Sichuan Province. The sun rose over misty

For this we must be strong...


Keep calm, breathe deeply and listen well.

When an earthquake strikes remember to...


DROP,


Blow a whistle or make some noise,

First stop, Colima Mexico!








So that's what they

COPE were staying at the Colima Wushu School.




That evening they tucked into delicious Mexican food.


If you are outside or not near a table,

They learnt how to pack earthquake survival bags.




COPE did drills to practice emergency exits.

I was scared and crying but my big brother looked after me... As soon as the shaking stopped we ran home to check on our parents.


Luckily they had made our home


earthquake resilient.

We were so relieved and happy they were safe.










COPE were all over the newspapers, $\dot{\cdot}$ on the local TV, $\dot{\cdot}$ and internet.



They performed at a soccer game, . . on the beach, . . and in the plaza.



















Sense was acting strange, banging her head against the door, over and over. But why?


A moment later, Grand Mistress Fu came in.

but thankfully there had been little damage.




Outside people were still crouching down covering their heads.
