

STATUS OF THE NAP PROCESSES IN BOLIVIA, ECUADOR AND PERU

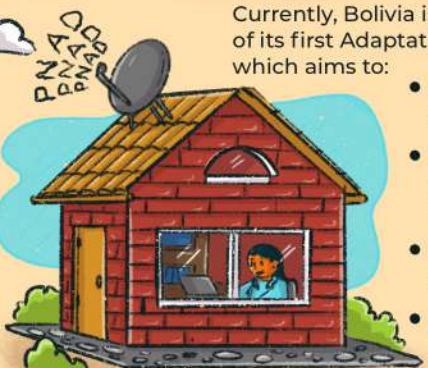
BOLIVIA

The country seeks to advance and structure its efforts on climate change adaptation and to prepare the ground for the future development of its National Adaptation Plan.



Currently, Bolivia is working on the development of its first Adaptation Communication (ADCOM), which aims to:

- Raise the profile and visibility of adaptation efforts.
- Improve the understanding of adaptation needs and actions.
- Strengthen financial support for climate action.
- Inform a synthesis report for the Global Stocktake (GST).



ECUADOR

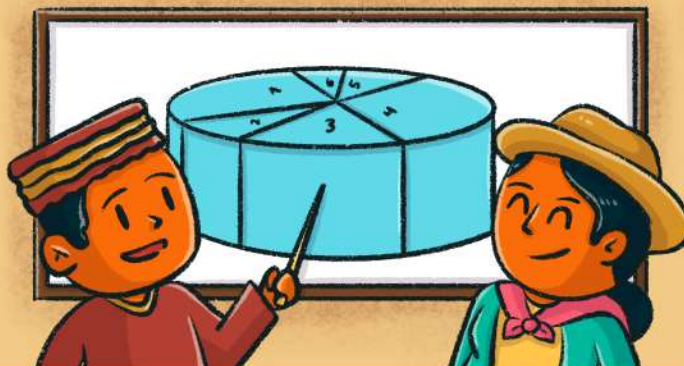
Ecuador's NAP was presented early in February 2023.

Led by the Ministry of Environment, Water and Ecological Transition, the NAP process kicked off in 2019 and was built through a participatory process that included 60 workshops with more than 2000 attendees.



THE NAP SETS OUT SIX PRIORITY SECTORS:

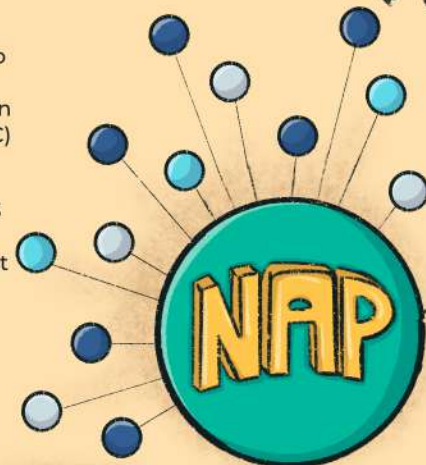
- Natural Heritage

PERÚ

Peru submitted its NAP to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC) in July 2021.

The document sets out 13 strategic actions that includes the development of meteorological services, the implementation of Ecosystem-based Adaptation actions, as well as the improvement of water supply systems for multisectoral use.



The country, through a multi-sector, multi-level and multi-stakeholder process, developed both virtually (within the framework of the COVID-19 pandemic) and face-to-face, received more than 1,300 contributions to the document. In this way, Peru built a robust document, which includes the perspective and contribution of all the stakeholders and sectors that strive to make adaptation an opportunity for sustainable development and well-being.
